- select paper (with >=8 pages) from the conference proceedings indicated at the course introduction slides
- select a date in class
- indicate the preferred paper via the form (links are available in Moodle)
- wait for approval of paper (posted on Moodle)
- read the paper presentation guidelines (available at the course web page and Moodle)
- prepare a 15 min presentation (~15 slides)
- submit the slides before lecture via Moodle



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# How to select a conference paper to present?

- Which general topic interests you most? (select the corresponding conference)

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- Human-Robot Interaction? HRI
- Mobile Computing? HCI Mobile
- Extended Reality? IEEE VR and 3D UIs
- Browse the Program in the selected conference site
- Select a few sessions addressing interesting topics
- Select a few papers that seems motivating you to read
- Read the abstracts and find a paper to see if you will be able to make a 15 minutes presentation adequate to the course lectures

# **Presentation Guidelines** - contents

- Presentation must:
  - Include in the 1rst slide:
    - The complete reference of the paper (authors, title, publication, date, pages)
    - Name, number, and study program of the presenter
    - Name of the course and date of presentation
  - Explain the choice of this paper
  - Make an introduction and contextualization of the problem
  - Present the main aspects (methods, results, ...) addressed in the paper
  - Present the most important conclusions (also in the presenter's opinion)
  - Include all the bibliography and sites used to prepare the presentation (last slide)

# **Presentations Guidelines**

- Presentations must:
  - Last for **15 minutes** (maximum)
  - Have ~15 slides
- Slides must:
  - Be in English, terse and coherent
  - Be numbered (except for the first one)
  - Not use too much text, too many colors, animations, complex backgrounds, etc.
  - Include figures, graphics, videos, demos, etc., if suitable

#### **Presenters**

- During the presentation, must:
  - use a formal, correct and accurate language
  - speak clearly, fluently and enthusiastically
  - Look at the audience and have a correct stance/ attitude
  - Do not exceed given time!

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#### Assessment

Paper presentation grading criteria:

- Adequacy of topic to the course and audience
- Slides: motivation, contents quality and level of detail, organization and layout
- Personal opinion on the subject
- Quality of the oral presentation and discussion,
- Adequacy of the presentation length and deadline compliance.

• Paper complexity and class voting will be also considered

#### Assessment

- Presentations will be evaluated:
  - By the course coordinator at the end of the semester
  - By all the students attending the presentation, after each presentation, voting via a link available in Moodle
- Using the following scale:
  - 5- Excellent
  - 4- Very good
  - 3- Good
  - 2- Sufficient
  - 1- Poor
- Taking into consideration:
  - Adequacy
  - Slides
  - Presentation
  - Discussion
  - Exceeded time?
